# Misplaced Modifiers






#### The Mad Hatter will be serving tea to Alice in a cup.

Consider in the example below, what happens when we move the modifier *only*.


Example: Only I saw John. (Only modifies I. No one else saw John)



I only saw John. (Only modifies saw. I didn't do anything else with or to John)



I saw only John. (Only modifies John. I didn't see anyone else)



Modifiers should be near what they describe. Otherwise, the modifiers will describe something else. *Misplaced modifiers* can be in the form of adjectives, adverbs, phrases, or clauses. Recall that a phrase is a group of connected words that does not contain both a subject and a verb and a clause is a group of words containing the combination of a subject and a verb.
